



# 24) WRISTLET KNITTED from “KNIT to VICTORY”  
 3 oz. acrylic worsted, please consult the color chart.  
 If you are making several, use both sets of numbers.  
 Mitt fits snug, not binding, entire piece is worked in  
 ribbing.

Style # 1: Requires seaming, #3, 5 or 6 needles,

Style # 2: Requires using dp needles.

Use your experience to judge, if you knit loose or tight.

Style # 1) Cast on 44 or 48sts,

Work K 2, P 2 for 9 to 10 inches, *Approximately* 50 rows. Finish off, with a good size tail.

Finishing: Using safety pins, match sts along long edge, approx. 9 to 10 inches. Weave up about 5 ½”. Thread yarn through one side for 1 ½” (thumb opening), weave remaining sts and finish off. Cut yarn and neatly weave in tail. Repeat for second mitt.

---

Style # 2: using # 3, 5 or 6 dp needles, need four (4) needles

Cast on 48 sts, loosely, on one needle, divide sts onto 3 needles and join careful not to twist. Work around in ribbing of K 2, P 2 for 2 ½ inches, ending with a k 1. Turn.

Next row:

1 K3, work in ribbing across next 44 sts, K1. Turn.

2 K1, work, in ribbing across next 46 sts, K1. Turn.

Repeat last 2 rows, 5 x’s for thumb opening.

Join and continue working around in ribbing as before until piece measures 10”.

Bind off loosely in ribbing pattern. Repeat for second mitt.

---

If you can make a thumb, once the mitt is sewn, pick up 22, 24 or 26 sts w/dp needles around the opening. The number depends on the size of the opening, work K 1, P 1 for 8 or 9 rows, bind off.

Before you attach the logo PLEASE write a short note to the service person, with your name & address on back. Using tapestry needle, secure **between the two mitts 2" from an edge to insure it is not torn off.**
